




MODIFIED GAP KERB - ELEVATION








CULVERT END CHILD PROTECTION DETAIL

RE: Howard Park Reserve - Roadworks and Fencing Upgrades

Good Afternoon all,

Yesterday, Gerry Wood reached out to me with several inquiries regarding the plan I distributed. I thought it would be a good idea to send an email to everyone to share the answers provided by the infrastructure team in case others have similar concerns. Gerry's questions were as follows with the responses below in red:

Bicycle Rack (closest to Howard Hall): Is there any potential within the project's scope to replace this rack as well? We can include the bicycle rack replacement in the quotation and if there are sufficient funds remaining we will include this aspect.

Removal of Underground Drainage: Are the drainage systems being replaced or upgraded? Council is removing the existing culvert as currently the water is being discharged at the playground. There will be a new culvert installed cutting across to the oval earlier.

Small Pathway: Is there any opportunity to include a small new pathway from the pedestrian access gate to the playground to minimize wear and tear on the grass?

The initial plan included installing a couple of gates in the quotation. The council will liaise further with the committee to place these strategically if access is an issue.
