



# What's a PIC and do you need one?

If you keep livestock on your block or in your backyard, you **MUST** register for a Property Identification Code (PIC)

## Do you keep livestock on your block?

Cattle, buffalo, horses (including mules and donkeys), pigs, poultry, deer, llamas, camels, alpacas, sheep, goats and beehives are all classified as livestock.

## Do you have a Property Identification Code?

If you have any of the above animals, even just one as a pet, no matter how big or small your property is, then you need a Property Identification Code. **Registering for a PIC is easy and free - register online at [nt.gov.au](http://nt.gov.au) or ask your Regional Livestock Biosecurity Officer how to register today!**

## Did you know certain requirements apply when moving livestock?

When moving livestock **within the NT**, you need to meet the following requirements:
