Purpose

To award the Contract for waste transportation from Council's three waste transfer stations, following an advertised tender process for RFT17-159 – Waste Transportation.

Summary

The request for tender RFT17-159 – Waste Transportation was publicly advertised on Tenderlink on 2 December 2017 and closed on 19 December 2017. In the Request for Tender (RFT), Council nominated a Schedule of Rates arrangement for a four-year contract period with an option of extensions for up to two years. Four tenders were received and the schedule of rates submitted by each tenderer were used by Council to estimate expenditure over the four-year life of the contract. The tenderers were:

Based on an assessment of the tenders in accordance with the assessment criteria specified by Council in the RFT, the tender submitted by Veolia Environmental Services (Australia) Pty Ltd was considered the preferred tender, estimated at approximately \$1,101,716 (GST inclusive) over a four-year period.

A separate evaluation report in the Confidential section of this meeting Agenda sets out additional information about the tender evaluation process.

Recommendation

THAT Council award a contract for *RT17-159 — Waste Transportation* to Veolia Environmental Services (Australia) Pty Ltd in accordance with their submitted tender, estimated at approximately \$1,101,716 (GST inclusive) over a four-year period.

Background

Completion of existing contract

The existing waste transportation contract is held by Veolia and dates back to 2012. It is set to conclude on 31 March 2018. The new contract will commence on 1 April 2018, subject to award by Council.

Tender submissions

The RFT called for a Schedule of Rates for the transport of waste from the three waste transfer stations to the Shoal Bay landfill as well as rates for the removal of waste oil from the three transfer stations and disposal at an offsite facility. At Council's preference, the schedule of rates was designated on a single trip basis, rather than a volumetric, weight or hourly basis.

In response to the RFT, Council received four tenders from the following organisations:

Tender Evaluation

A three-person tender assessment panel (TEP) comprising the Waste Manager, Director Corporate and Community Services and an Engineering Officer carried out an assessment of each submitted tender against the criteria set out in the RFT. Council also engaged probity advisory services from KPMG Darwin to supervise the tender evaluation process from a probity perspective.

The TEP considered any possible risks associated with the work and determined that each tenderer had properly understood and tendered for the works. Based on an assessment of the tenders and in accordance with the assessment criteria, the tender submitted by Veolia Environmental Services (Australia) Pty Ltd achieved the highest score and was subsequently considered the preferred tender.

The preferred tender is within Council's budget allocation for waste transportation services over the four-year contract term.
