Executive Summary

Total revenue of \$477,540 as of the end of October reflects an increase in both cremations and burials and represents 51% of the budgeted revenue

Total year to date expenses of \$249,567 is 27% of the budgeted expenditure.

Financial year results for 2019-20 have been finalised awaiting approval by Council at the Special Council meeting 11 November 2020. Once approved by Council, results will be included in the monthly finance reports going forward.
