Purpose

The purpose of this report is to present the monthly financial report for Thorak Regional Cemetery for the period ended 31 May 2017.

Recommendation

THAT Council receive the Thorak Regional Cemetery finance report for the period ended 31 May 2017.

OPERATING RESULT

The forecast end of year result for 2016/17 is a \$49,308 favourable variance to budget, with a forecast overall operating surplus of \$13,900.

End of financial year revenue is forecast to be unfavourable to budget by \$53,424 due to the 30% reduction in burials from 2016/17 financial year, demonstrating the national trend that cremations are preferable to burials.

Thorak Cemetery had 13 internments and cremations (4 burials and 9 cremations) compared to 19 (10 burials and 9 cremations) at the same time last year. Year to date total at the end of May was 228 interments and cremations (89 burials and 127 cremations), similar to the total number of 225 at the same period last year. The main difference however is the split of 127 burials and 85 cremations.

Expenditure is forecast to be \$102,732 less than budget.

Revenue and expenditure levels will continue to be monitored closely as the end of the financial year draws near.

Legislative and Policy Implications

Local Government (Accounting) Regulations and the Northern Territory Cemeteries Act.

Risk

There remains an ongoing financial sustainability challenge for Council in operating the Thorak Regional Cemetery.

The Mayor and CEO met with the Minister for Housing and Community Development; the Hon Gerald McCarthy on 10 May 2017 to discuss the Thorak Regional Cemetery.

The proposition Litchfield Council presented was that the Minister support Litchfield Council with its legislative responsible for the Cemetery, recognising that it is a regional (not local) service and that a funding model needs to be developed to ensure long term sustainability.

The Minister committed to considering this matter further and appeared to be sympathetic to Council's argument that it is impractical and inequitable to expect Litchfield ratepayers to subsidise a regional community service and to maintain liabilities and capital expenditure over time.

Financial Implications

The forecast result for 30 June 2017 is expected to be favourable to budget despite the continued preference trend of cremations to burials resulting in a reduction in revenue. The unique circumstances of 2016/17 has realised operating savings which have contributed to the overall forecast operating surplus.
