9. PUBLIC FORUM

Questions and comments from the Public Forum are paraphrased below.

9.1 Mark Sweet – Resident of Virginia / Owner VTG Waste & Recycling and Finn Bins

Mr Sweet addressed Council regarding item 15.11 Waste Strategy 2018-2023 and in particular the proposal to charge waste providers for the delivery of residential waste to the Humpty Doo Waste Transfer Station.

Mr Sweet applauded Council on its Waste Strategy as a good introduction to developing a longer-term plan in reducing waste to landfill and engage industry and business.

He did however, raise his concerns in relation to the document referring to the waste being transport from ratepaying residents labelled as commercial waste.

Mr Sweet also expressed his concern to reference made within the report to the waste transported by his company is unsorted and stated that his customers endeavours to recycle are no different to the rest of the community.

Mr Sweet quoted figures from Council's 2016/17 Annual Report and believed Council were in a surplus in regard to Waste Management. He also added that his customers are elderly and frail who struggle physically to transfer their rubbish, young families struggling to make ends meet, customers who struggle with time and those without transport.

Mr Sweet requested the Council to reject the proposal to charge again for residential waste.

15.11 Waste Strategy 2018-2023

THAT Council

- 1. adopt the Waste Strategy 2018-2023 as included at Attachment B, with the following amendment:
 - remove Action 1.2 Introduce commercial waste charge on all loads delivered by private waste collectors;
- continue to engage with Waste Collection Providers to explore ways to decrease waste to landfill by introducing recycling services or other services, as part of their residential kerb side service;
- 3. allow Waste Collection Providers to deposit waste collected from residential properties for free at the Humpty Doo Waste Transfer Station, providing they can submit evidence that the waste has been collected from residential properties within the Litchfield Municipality;
- 4. reviews its decision to allow Waste Collection Providers to deposit for free, residential waste collected from within the Litchfield Municipality as part of the development of the next waste strategy in 2023; and
- 5. authorise the Chief Executive Officer to make minor editorial changes, as necessary.
